The second deliverable in the Chess project is the software architecture specification that describes the data structures and software organization, as well as the development plan. Similar to the user manual, this document can be refined in the following weeks so that it matches the actual implementation in detail. However, in contrast to the user manual which is intended to be read by the software user (consumer), the software architecture document is meant for the developers (producer) who implement the software components and later maintain the software product. Specifically, the software architecture document should describe the overall software architecture, the installation and configuration of the source code, and in detail the data structures and algorithms used, together with all major functions and their parameters.

For full credit (100%), the document submitted by your team should include the following sections:

- Author/producer, affiliation

- Glossary (of terms used in the implementation)

- 3.3 Detailed description of input and output formats

- Syntax/format of a move input by the user
- Syntax/format of a move recorded in the log file
